Retirement In April we heard that Malcolm Taylor is stepping down from his post as Library Director of the Vaughan Williams Memorial Library of the English Folk Dance and Song Society (EFDSS) after 35 years.

"Malcolm has been an influential figure at the VW Library for so long, and where he has offered substantial help to many members of the Morris Ring (as well as others!) who, over the years, have been researching Morris related matters. The Morris Ring feels that it is appropriate to formally register our sincere appreciation and thanks for all his work during his 35 years with EFDSS. He will be missed and will be a hard act to follow."

"Malcolm has been an exemplary Director and for much of his tenure, for much of the wider world, Malcolm Taylor was EFDSS. His work has been acknowledged with the EFDSS Gold Badge, an OBE and Roots Award at the BBC Folk Awards 2012, the first non-musician to receive this award.

Youth Fund This has been used to assist the Sussex Primary Schools Morris Festival and Mike Stevens "Great Eastern Morris Workshop". The fund is now very low on cash and if we wish to continue to support youth projects from the fund an urgent injection of cash is needed. The AGM season is upon us and it would be a good opportunity to remind sides of the fund and to ask for their support.

"In 2009 the Morris Ring set up a Youth Fund to support the formation of new sides of young men. Since that time the parameters of projects which the fund supports have been widened and now the fund is available to support any project which gets young people dancing the morris. Donations have been made to the Plumpton Children's Morris Festival in Sussex and support was given to The Great Eastern Morris Workshop run by Mike Stevens in the Eastern Area. A report on this event was published in the Winter 2013/14 edition of the MR Circular. This project was designed to improve the dancing skills of boys and young men and participants were aged between thirteen and twenty years. It is hoped that similar projects can be run in other parts of the country but this can only be supported by the Morris Ring if it has dedicated funds available."

Can you or your side follow the fine example of Mayflower?

"At our AGM last night, it was agreed that our side would like to make a donation of £300 to the Youth Fund. We feel that this is excellent work and the right way to keep the tradition going."

The Feast and accommodation numbers are limited to 120 bods.

This meeting of Morris Ring sides is based around the 9th SIBA South East of England Beer Festival held at the grounds of the Tonbridge Juddians Rugby Club, (TN9 1HR), which is located behind Tonbridge Castle and close to the High Street with its pubs and restaurants.

Our aim is to design a low cost, pay-as-you-go meeting, but with a proper Hartley style Feast. (Good food, beer and company, no speeches, just toasts followed by singing etc.)



Accommodation: Indoor camping will be in the Juddians clubhouse, adjacent to the Beer Festival. A limited number of tents and campervans can be located in the club grounds. The clubhouse has numerous changing rooms and showers. We can sleep in the large hall and the changing rooms. An en-suite changing room will be set aside for Female Musicians.

The Siba Beer Festival Marquee and the Rugby Clubhouse All meals (other than the Feast) can be purchased from the Beer Festival, or the pubs and cafes in the Town. These

include a range of pubs including Wetherspoons and most of the national restaurant chains.

Costs: The only fixed charge for the weekend will be in the region of £23. This will cover the cost of the Feast and accommodation in the club house or grounds. If you want to come for the day or part of the weekend, please contact us.

Expressions of interest by January 1st and FULL payment by 1st May

The proposed programme for the meeting is:-

Friday 10th July - Evening - informal socialising at the festival or in the town. Meals at the festival barbecue or in the Town at cost. Bed down from after Beer Festival closes at 11pm.

Saturday 11th July - showers etc., then clear hall and stow bedding in secure changing rooms. Breakfast at local Wetherspoons etc. Clear hall by 11am when Beer Festival opens. Dance displays throughout the day at the Beer Festival and designated sites around Tonbridge (possible tours to local villages by service buses). It is hoped to organise a massed display in the afternoon. Evening, Feast then socialising, etc. The Beer Festival closes at 11pm. Most town pubs stay open until later. Bed down from after Beer Festival closes at 11pm.

Sunday 12th July - as Saturday until 11am. Dance displays throughout the day at the Beer Festival and designated sites around Tonbridge. We will be joined by other local Morris sides and the day will be organised as a Regional JMO Day of Dance.
